Ceremony



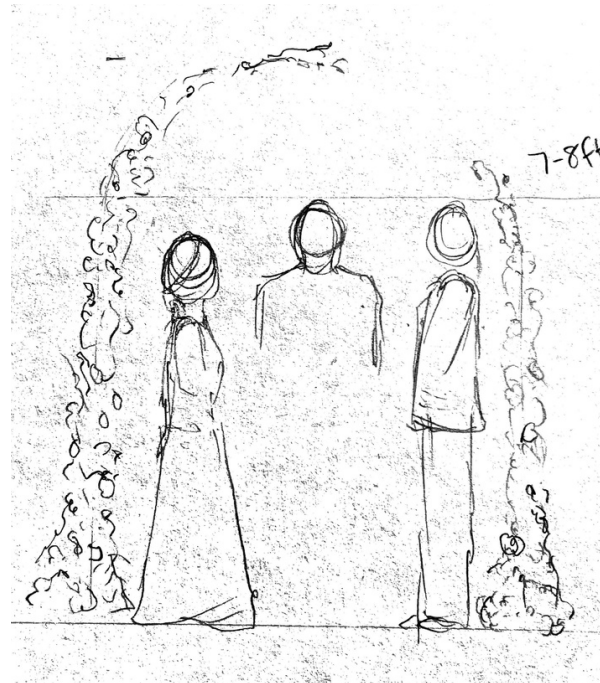
Corner Arbor Installation

\$500-\$600

A lush display of greenery and flowers decorate the top right corner of an existing arbor. This is our most popular option.

Disconnected Arch

\$2500-\$4500

A disconnected arch offers high visual impact at the ceremony site and can usually be moved indoors for the reception. The arch can be made thick and lush, or more slender and delicate than shown in the above photo. Approximately 7-8ft tall at peak.

Full Floral Arbor

\$1500-\$4000

Each side of an existing arbor structure will be covered with greens and flowers. If desired, this can be made more dense than examples shown above depending on on stability of arbor structure.

The bottom can be softened by adding meadow boxes.

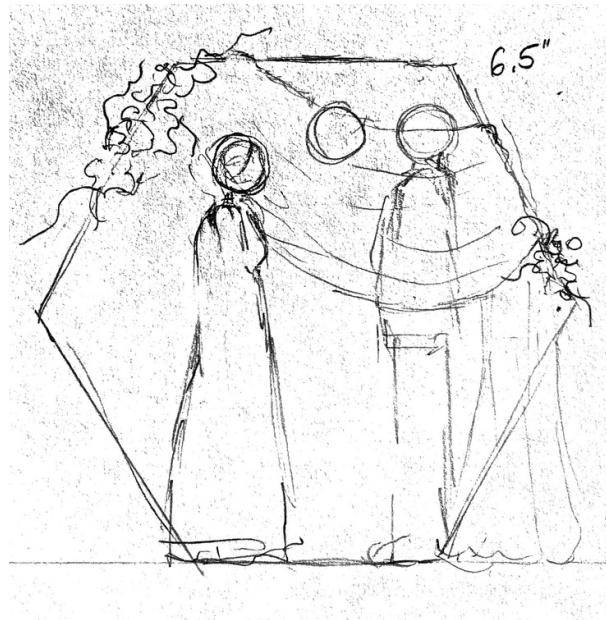
Arbor with Simple Greens:

\$500-\$750

Greens will trail around arbor from one side to the other. Greenery can be light or more lush.

Circular or Hexagonal Arch

\$500-\$750

A hexagonal or circular arch, either rented from the venue, a planner, or provided by the Farm, will be decorated with greenery and flowers on the upper right portion. Couples can choose to add another smaller installation on the left hand side.

Aisle Markers



Meadow Boxes

\$140-\$200

Meadow boxes are long, narrow arrangements that can line the aisle. The rectangular vessel is usually hidden so the flowers almost look like they're growing out of the ground. They can sit at every other chair, every chair, or even closer together for a continuous, lush look.

Meadow boxes can be moved to reception area in front of sweet heart table, to the sides of rectangular tables, etc. They are generally quite tall, so they would not work on top of guest tables.

Elevated Aisle Markers

\$300-\$550

Large arrangements may sit atop pillars or gold metal flower stands. These usually stand behind the last row of chairs at the back of the aisle.

These can be moved after the ceremony to the sides of the sweetheart table, the entrance to the reception space, etc.

Signage



Signage Decor

Greenery: \$40

Floral Swag: \$75

A welcome sign or seating chart can be decorated with greenery or a floral swag - a small arrangement attached to the sign. This can sit in the center at the top or bottom, or on any corner.



Table Decor



Elevated Arrangements

\$300-\$500

Large, lush arrangements sit atop gold metal floral stands in the center of the table. These make a statement - they are visually impactful. They work best for indoor weddings - any wind could compromise the stability of this arrangement.

These work best with round tables, or as part of a series on rectangular or farm tables.

Oblong Compote

\$200

This compote centerpiece works well for rectangular tables. Instead of a rounder shape, this style is long and narrow, complimenting the shape of the table.



Medium Compote or Bowl Arrangement

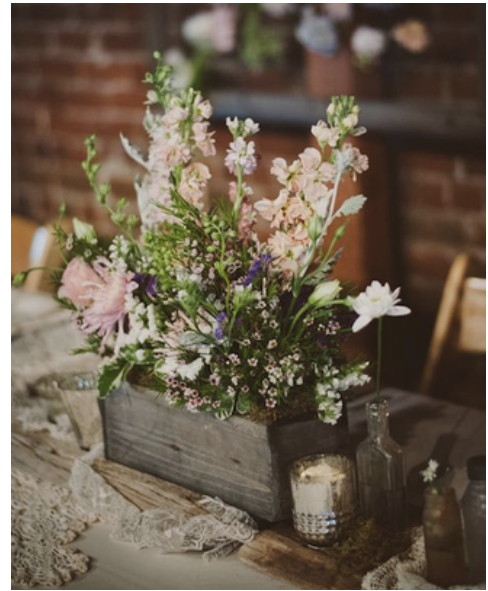

This compote centerpiece works well for round tables. This is a timeless choice that has a high visual impact. It works well for indoor or outdoor receptions. The standard size we use fills the center of the table without crowding it, and is low enough so guests can see across the table.

Meadow Box

\$175

This long, narrow shape works well on rectangular tables. It's a great choice for outdoor weddings because it's very stable. We prefer to make them longer and lower than shown in the images here. Lower is preferable so as not to block guests' view across the table.



Greenery on Round Table with Candles

\$130

Three candles or budvases create a framework for greenery sprouting from the center of the table

Greenery Runner for rectangular table

Greens only: \$120

Greens with flowers: \$200

Greens will be placed along the center of the table. Flowers and candles can be added in.

Small Arrangements

\$75

Small arrangements can be used in a series along rectangular tables or as a group in the center of a round table. These can be done in cascading sizes to create more visual interest. They can be used throughout the reception space on the dessert table, memorial table, guest book table, or restrooms.

For outdoor events, the vessels used will be shorter and wider to provide stability in case of wind.

Mini Compote or Bowl

\$75

This compote centerpiece works well for high top tables during cocktail hour, a sweetheart table, or extra tables like dessert tables.





Budvases

\$20 each

Budvases in various shapes and sizes can be placed along the center of a rectangular table or grouped in the middle of a round table. Bud vases may contain one to five stems of small focal flowers, filler flowers, and greenery.

Candles can be incorporated with budvases. Budvases are not a good choice for outdoor weddings because they can blow over if there's any breeze.

Sweetheart Table Decor

Price varies, \$70-250

The sweetheart table can be draped with greenery. Light flowers can be incorporated into the greens. A focal arrangement can be created in the front center of the table.

Candles

Always double check with your venue to ensure they allow open flame

Votive Candles

\$5 each

The most economical option and the safest option. Votives are low and wide, which makes them resistant to wind or a guest accidentally knocking one over.

Pillar Candles

\$15

Pillar candles sit in glass cylinders in cascading sizes along the center of a rectangular table or in the middle of a round table. Pillar candles contained in glass are generally a safe option for indoor or outdoor events.

Floating Candles

\$15

Floating candles sit in glass cylinders in cascading sizes along the center of a rectangular table or in the middle of a round table. Floating candles contained in glass with water are generally a safe option for indoor or outdoor events.

Taper Candles

\$20

Taper candles in candlesticks will be surrounded by glass chimneys for safety. While very elegant, these are not a safe choice for outdoor events. The risk of being knocked over by wind is too high.

Hanging Greens



Greens for Lighting

Price varies, approximately \$200 each

Light, trailing greens can hang from chandelier-type lighting fixtures. This helps draw the eye upward and create an garden/woodland ambiance.

Greens on Tent Poles

\$300 each

Similar to greens on lighting fixtures, greens on tent poles will create height and give the space a natural feel, softening the starkness of a tent.



Greens on Entrance

Price varies, approximately \$400

This installation can generally be done on any entrance, indoors or outdoors. This can be done with simple, light greens or made to be more lush or include flowers.
